**PR/IT>Webmaster** – Faith Hamilton – has access to web site aiming for more social media and help from Leos; asking for clubs to have a marketing POC; Eagle River has a new page that was successful for the 4<sup>th</sup> of July celebration; lionssmile.org has all sorts of information for creating social media pages

**Sight & Vision Screening** – PDG Esther West, co-chairs: totals topped last year’s screenings; state referral rate is 8.3%, down from 12%; school nurse training last week so schools booked for Sept and Oct. Aiming to have two teams to cover the four days per week; screening middle and high schools this year. Training for state fair includes the adult vision screener that is the same as DMV.

**Guatamala Mission** – Five team members, 2<sup>nd</sup> VDG Brian Sproat, PID Doc Meyers, Carmen Jameson, Rory, Kathy Morin in attendance at cabinet meeting; different target projects; lack of basic medical and sight care in mission area; positive experience for those helped

**Alaska Center for Blind and Visually Impaired:** Regan Mattingly – 2017 is 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary; Dining in the Dark fund raiser Oct 21 at Hotel Captain Cook (eating in sleep shades); new program includes a permanent youth program (age 14 and up); rural low vision clinics originally started with grant from LCI, now taken over by state; need to raise \$100,000 in for matching funds for building renovations. Lion Kevin is now manual skills instructor.

**Vision Screening at State Fair:** Lion Bonnie – Sept 2 and Sept 4 still open – need help. Due to basic costs to have the trailer at the fair, clubs are asked to pay for their own entry tickets.

**Quest Program** – IPDG Karen Burns – Quest is a social and emotional learning program that is being adopted by Anchorage School District (ASD). Funds were raised for matching grant that was approved

by LCI + corporate grant from Northrim Bank; 12 spots open for training, 6 have been filled for training in September with teachers. Materials are available for review. PID Lewis reports possible expansion into Yukon Kuskokwim School District and also Mat-Su School District.

**International Relations** – Walter Hays: able to visit families in Guatemala that received homes a few years ago; Lions Quest in ASD, ASD Superintendent will visit us at MidWinter.

Cathy Tilton: sponsor of Citation for Lions International from State Legislature, and read it to the attendees; the copy of the proclamation was at Mt View Lions club and Eagle River will host the proclamation next.
